Sulfite



Sulfite is a purposefully imperfect typeface with warmth and friendliness key to its distinction. Drawing of the typeface began with an intuitive approach with its character evolving in an organic manner. As the typeface started to define itself, references were sought out to solidify coherency. The process of development started around the heavier weights. With their respective 'bulk' it was more clear where opportunities lay in defining the personality of Sulfite. The extreme heavy weight was a priority early on. Oppose to being treated as a 'heavier' version of a lighter weight, considerations were given to the Extra Black to ensure it could stand alone as much as it could be part of a family. With the identity of Sulfite defined, personality traits worked their way down through the spectrum with consideration allowing the lighter styles to play a more pratical role in application. In the spirit of character, alternate letterforms are included to extend the dynamics of the typeface.

In 1963, Prewitt sold his fiberglass business (including the Bunyan mold) to Steve Dashew, who saw the potential of adapting the figure. He realized that only a limited number of businesses would want a lumberjack but he could broaden the appeal of the giant statue by modifying it with different versions: the cleanshaven classic Muffler Man (who often held giant automobile

Dashew's company, International Fiberglass, turned out thousands of commercial statues in the 1960s and '70s, including hundreds of Muffler Men. As the fiberglass molds for this initial figure existed, similar characters were readily created by keeping the same basic characteristics (such as the right palm up, left palm down position in which the original Bunyan lumberjack figure held his axe) with minor variation. Various fiberglass molds allowed different heads, limbs, or torsos to be substituted to create multiple variant characters. International Fiberglass took a

Muffler Men are generally between 14–25 feet tall, and have a hollow fiberglass construction. Most fall into a few basic types. The Classic Muffler Man is configured with all the basic characteristics: well-chiseled facial bones, prominent brow and squarish "lantern" jaw. Eyes appear to stare blankly into the middle distance, or may be painted to leer down at visitors. They have broad-shoulders and wear a short-sleeved shirt with fake shirt folds. Pockets, suspenders, shirt patterns were sometimes painted on. Their arms are bent at the elbow, left palm facing down, right palm facing up, with an open grasp to hold an axe, muffler, golf club, etc. They have big, blocky shoes that measure about 4 feet from heel to toe.
